Client Outputs or Outcomes

1. 250 Veterans received over 85,000 nights of stay in the single room occupancy residence.
2. The Food Panty provided 750,985 meals to 35,987 individuals.
3. 64,000 meals were served to seniors in the home delivered meal program (Meals on Wheels)
4. 234 families, including 212 infants, received home visits from a case worker who checked developmental milestones in the first year.
5. 97% of the seniors in our care coordination programs forestalled institutional placement because of our services.
6. The viral suppression rate of clients in the HIV/AIDS Case Management Program is 89.34%, which is 6.15% higher than the local Eligible Metropolitan Area (EMA) rate of 83.19%!
7. The Summer Youth Employment program assisted 110 youth in funding summer employment.

Research information

- a. The study, by the consulting firm RTI International and the LeadingAge Center for Applied Research, was published by the federal Department of Health and Human Services It found some SASH locations reduced Medicare costs by as much as \$1,450 annually, largely by reducing costs for hospital care. It also found that the program may help older adults stay at home and delay or even prevent their move to a nursing home or other institutional care facility.
- b. Enrolling youth in summer job programs reduced violent crime arrests by 43% over 16 months.
- c. Risk of HIV transmission to uninfected partners is greatly reduced when an individual with HIV is in antiretroviral therapy (ART) to suppress the virus. It also prevents perinatal transmission of HIV. (Viral suppression decreases the risk of transmission, thus improving public health)
- d. Veteran homelessness increased 20 percent in Chicago from 500 veterans in 2011 to 601 veterans in 2016. In the U.S., Veterans make up approximately 9 percent of all homeless adults.
- e. 21 years after randomization, the maternal mortality rate for low-income mothers in the control group was 3.7% compared to mothers with perinatal home visiting with 0.4%.
- f. Food insecure Baby Boomers are more likely to experience chronic health conditions like diabetes and have reduced muscle mass, poor vision, and lower bone density.
- g. According to Feeding America's Map the Meal Gap Study, 1 in 7 people in Cook County will experience food insecurity this year. Food insecurity is usually episodic and often cyclical.
