

Back to the Future: Road Test Planning Worksheet

Scenario: Time Travel Troubles

AREA FOR IMPROVEMENT:

People keep using the time machine without following any clear process. This leads to confusion, overlapping travel plans, and major disruptions to the timeline.

ROOT CAUSES:

- There is no consistent system for how people log their time travel.
- Different travelers do things their own way, so you can't keep track of who's where in time.
- Travelers often forget important steps or mix up dates.

GOAL:

Ensure that people prepare for and manage time travel, so that everyone can:

- Travel safely
- Avoid timeline mix-ups
- Make it easier for you and your team to keep track of trips

PLAN: Define Your Strategy

- What is the specific strategy you want to road test?
- Why THIS strategy?
- Who will you involve in this small-scale test?
- What is your timeframe? (e.g., 2 weeks, 3 sessions)

LEARNING QUESTIONS

Develop 1–3 learning questions to guide your test. Focus on implementation and early outcomes.

Examples:

Implementation: Did staff have what they needed to support travelers during the test?

Early outcomes: Do travelers feel more confident and prepared after using the new process?

DO: Test the Strategy
DO. lest the strategy
How will you carry out this test?What materials, tools, or training will you need?
What materials, tools, or training will you need?What steps will staff/participants take?
STUDY: Collect Feedback & Data
 What feedback or data will you collect to answer your learning questions?
Who will collect it? How and when?
How will you analyze it quickly to learn from the test?
ACT: Adapt, Adopt, or Abandon (<i>optional</i>)
Based on your findings, what will you do next?
 Adopt (keep the strategy)
Adapt (tweak and test again)Abandon (try something new)
What could your next steps look like?
