### **PURPOSE OF THE CONFERENCE**

The CQI Community Group's annual conference is a capacity building and networking event that brings together leaders, practitioners, and visionaries from diverse sectors. It is an opportunity for people from a variety of professional backgrounds to come together to explore strategies for developing, managing, and participating in the CQI process that will lead to better outcomes for children, adults, families, and communities. The conference will have sessions for professionals of all levels from basic to advanced CQI knowledge and skills.

### **CQI IS FOR EVERYONE**

When we say CQI is for everyone, we mean everyone. Our audience is primarily CQI staff, but also includes leadership and direct-service staff from community-based, academic, state, behavioral health, medical, and government settings. The CQI Community Group promotes diversity among workshop presenters and is committed to building a vibrant and empowered community.

We encourage submissions from a variety of professional affiliations (government, academic, corporate, non-profit, medical, behavioral health, or community-based providers), organization sizes (small, medium, or large), experience levels (whether you are a subject matter expert with a research team or a quality improvement peer with a great idea), and geography (both inside and outside Illinois). Collaborative sessions representing multiple organizations are also encouraged. We want to hear from you!

### **KEY FOCUS AREAS**

We are seeking proposals that provide practical, proven, or promising CQI strategies, methods, and tools. Strong proposals will demonstrate how improvement efforts help organizations strengthen systems, support people, and create lasting impact.

Presentation styles include the following:

- **Impact Stories:** A short 15 minute, story-driven session highlighting how an organization created or implemented a CQI strategy or method, including key successes and challenges in the field (Ted Talk-Style).
- **Informative:** This session is centered on the transfer of knowledge through structured formats such as panels, case studies, lecture, or sharing practical organizational lessons learned.
- **Collaborative:** This session includes group activities, panels (Q&A), roundtables, or group learning with discussion between presenters and attendees.
- **Skill-Building:** This is a step-by-step skill-building interactive session with demonstrations, teaching, hands-on practice, and take-home resources.

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Suggested topics include, but are *not limited* to:

- **Stabilizing Systems Under Pressure:**  
Improving reliability in high-risk or high-stress processes, reducing variability, strengthening safety practices, mitigating risks, and using CQI to create stability during times of change or uncertainty.
- **Supporting and Sustaining the Workforce:**  
Improving staff experience, reducing burden, strengthening engagement, and creating psychologically safe, learning-focused environments.
- **Strengthening Relationships with Families and Communities**  
Authentic engagement of families and individuals with lived experience, trust-building, feedback loops, culturally responsive practices, and community partnerships.
- **Using Data as a Tool for Learning**  
Meaningful measurement, data visualization, balancing qualitative and quantitative information, data storytelling, and shifting from compliance-driven reporting to learning-driven improvement.
- **Designing Systems That Work for Real Life**  
Process mapping, workflow redesign, reducing inefficiencies, simplifying systems, and designing with staff and families in mind.
- **Growing Leadership Capacity at Every Level**  
CQI as a leadership mindset, change management, shared ownership of improvement, and aligning CQI with strategic direction.
- **Moving From Short-Term Fixes to Sustainable Impact**  
Scaling improvements, embedding CQI into daily practice, governance structures, and building adaptive learning systems.
